## CARDBOARD



### Yes please:

- Cardboard
- Carton from groceries such as toothpaste, cereals, and similar
- Corrugated cardboard
- Cardboard rolls from tissue and toilet paper
- Egg boxes

### What about this?

#### Pizza boxes:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Milk cartons:

Sort out as residual waste

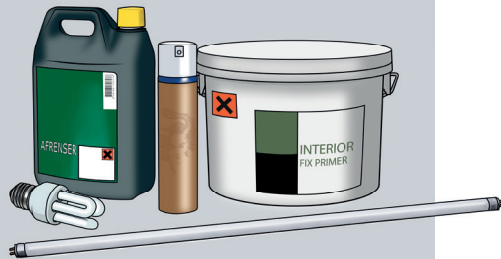
#### Styrofoam:

Sort out as residual waste

## HAZARDOUS WASTE



### Yes please:

- Batteries and accumulators
- Energy-saving bulbs and fluorescent tubes
- Insecticides and pesticides
- Chemicals residues
- Mercury thermometers
- Paints and varnish
- Waste oils
- Fertilisers

### Note:

You must always discard jugs, bottles, and other containers marked with an orange hazard symbol in the original packaging.

### What about this?

#### Drug residues and drugs packaging:

Return to pharmacy

**Syringes:** Return to pharmacy

**Pressure bottles:** Sort out and bring to the recycling centre

#### Self-igniting rags and liquids:

Sort out and bring to the recycling centre

#### Sharps:

Sort out and bring to the recycling centre

#### Fireworks and explosives:

Sort out and bring to the recycling centre



## PAPER



### Yes please:

- Newspapers, weeklies, magazines, junk mail
- Letters and envelopes
- Brochures
- Copying paper
- Writing and drawing paper

### What about this?

#### Carton and cardboard:

Sort out as cardboard

#### Gift wrap paper:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Bags for cereals, flour, and other food products:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Books:

Sort out and bring to the recycling centre

#### Gift wrap ribbon and bows:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Pizza boxes:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Egg boxes:

Sort out as cardboard



## PLASTICS



### Yes please:

- Plastic trays for meat, vegetables, fruit
- Plastic containers and cups for, for instance, yoghurt and ice cream
- Plastic bottles and jugs for, for instance, detergents, shampoo, juice
- Plastic foil wrap and plastic bags
- Toys such as buckets, spades, water guns
- Bubble wrap and plastic film
- Covers for DVDs and CDs

### What about this?

#### Styrofoam:

Sort out as residual waste

#### Jugs, bottles, other containers marked with an orange hazard symbol:

Sort out as hazardous waste

#### Rubber:

Sort out as bulky waste

#### Whipping bowls and other melamine products:

Sort out as residual waste

#### PVC such as rain gear, paddling toys, swim wings and plumbing tubes:

Sort out as bulky waste

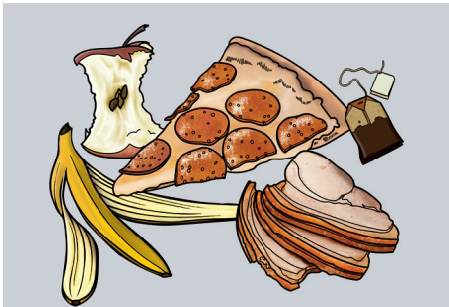
**Plastics containing small electronic items:** (items with a battery or connected to electric current) Sort out as hazardous waste

## FOOD WASTE



### Yes please:

- All food waste without packaging, cooked or raw
- Fruit and vegetables
- Meat, bones
- Egg shells
- Fish and sea fruit
- Coffee filters and tea bags
- Cut flowers
- Tissue paper

### What about this?

**Nappies, cotton swabs, single use hand towels:**

Sort out as residual waste

**Pizza boxes:**

Sort out as residual waste

**Milk and juice cartons:**

Sort out as residual waste

**Garden waste:**

Sort out as garden waste

**Cat litter, dog dropping bags, animal bedding:**

Sort out as residual waste, in a closed bag



## RESIDUAL WASTE



### Yes please:

- Milk and juice cartons
- Pizza boxes
- Chips and coffee bags
- Nappies and sanitary towels
- Vacuum cleaner bags
- Gift wrap paper
- Styrofoam
- Cat litter, dog dropping bags, animal bedding

### What about this?

**Batteries and energy-saving bulbs:**  
Sort out as hazardous waste

**Small electronic items:**  
In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**Paper:** Sort out as paper

**Plastics:** Sort out as plastics

**Jugs, bottles, other containers marked with an orange hazard symbol:**  
Sort out as hazardous waste

**Plastics containing electronic items:**  
(items with a battery or connected to electric current):

In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**Food waste:** Sort out as food waste

**Glass:** Sort out as glass

**Metal:** Sort out as metal

**Cardboard:** Sort out as cardboard



## GLASS



### Yes please:

- Glass bottles
- Jam jars
- Preserve glass
- Wine bottles
- Drinking glasses
- Broken glass

### What about this?

**Crystalware and glass arts objects:**  
In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**China such as plates, cups, jugs:**  
In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**Heat-resistant cookware:**  
In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**Energy-saving bulbs:**  
Sort out as hazardous waste

**Broken glass swept from the floor:**  
Sort out as bulky waste

**Mirrors:**  
Sort out as bulky waste



## METAL



### Yes please:

- Preserve cans
- Beverage cans
- Metal lids, for instance from jars
- Bottle caps
- Capsules from tea light candles
- Pots and pans
- Foil trays
- Cutlery, scissors, cutting knives
- Aluminium foil

### What about this?

**Metal containing electronic items:**  
(items with a battery or connected to electric current): In hazardous waste box or to the recycling centre

**Spray cans:**  
Sort out as hazardous waste

**Chips and coffee bags:**  
Sort out as residual waste

**Freezer and thermal bags:**  
Sort out as residual waste
